Russell 1000 Value The Russell 1000<sup>®</sup> Value Index is an unmanaged market capitalization-weighted index of value-oriented stocks of the largest U.S. domiciled companies that are included in the Russell 1000 Index. Value-oriented stocks tend to have lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values.

**PCUSA Quarterly Blend** The PCUSA Quarterly Blend Index is a custom benchmark that is made up of the the Russell 3000 Index, and the Fidelity Intermediate Treasury Bond Index Fund- Premium Class. The Russell 3000 Index is an unmanaged market capitalization-weighted index that includes the 3,000 largest U.S. companies representing approximately 98 percent of the investable U.S equity market.
